Election of Executive Board Member

- Garrett Bragalone's executive board member position is up for election.
- Garrett reviewed duties and expectations of the Executive Board member.
- Nominating Committee did not have any nominees.
- Nominations were taken from the floor.
 - Garrett was nominated again for 3-year term
 - No other nominations
- Open vote was taken from floor in place of paper ballots All in favor – Motion Carried

ACC Update

• Garrett and Fran presented the ACC's proposal for completing the landscaping around the sign that was drafted in late 2017 amount the ACC team.

- The proposal contained 3 detailed plans with estimated costs of materials. Design #3 was chosen by the ACC to be the preferred design. Labor costs were not associated with each design until firm ideas were in place. Once ideas obtained, we need action a landscaper to give a proper estimate for labor costs.
- A discussion took place on the feasibility, cost and maintenance of the landscaping.
 - Garrett had concerns about the heavy upfront costs associated without labor with all designs and maintenance of the proposed designs. He suggested to proceed with items that were most practical and prioritize necessities in a phased approach.
 - A proposed budget of \$2500 was given to the ACC to focus on phase 1: irrigation system for the current trees around the sign, rock bed, minimal plantings and fill dirt. ACC will get bids or volunteers to complete the project.

Dues Increase Discussion

- The HOA dues increased for 2018 from \$30 a month to \$40.
- Garrett presented some graphics and historical data to explain why the dues increase was needed. Although the HOA does it best to keep costs down, there are always increases in maintenance, water leases and services as well as keeping enough in the reserves for any emergency irrigation system issues. He also presented a document explaining the basics of the association's water shares to help homeowners understand how the system works. These documents will be added to the website for anyone to access.

 - HOA Main Expenses Over Time
 - HOA Income vs Expense, vs Savings

Irrigation System Update

- Irrigation Pump Status Bearing maintenance was performed on the pump late 2017.
- Water Outlook 2018 The HOA is in negotiations with a few resources to obtain water leases for 2018. Contracts to be signed early June. There are also negotiations to lease the Panama shares the HOA owns but unable to use. Garrett reminded everyone conservations is needed.
- Backflow Testing The testing was rescheduled a few times due to weather, Garrett thanked everyone who was prepared.
- Section 18 Ditch / MSP Development The developers have scheduled a date to replace the ditch between the golf course and Pine Cone. There will be 1-2 days of ditch downtime in June while this is completed. Owl Lake is first in line to test the new system.





Basics of Owl Lake Estates Water Shares

HOA Owned Water (River Water)


- Shares of Coal Ridge Ditch
 - Usable shares @ 11 shares
 - Average Yield = 25-40 acre feet (depending on conditions)
 - o Delivered via the Coal Ridge Ditch and Section 18 Water Users
 - Can only can run river water through late June, early July, then at end of season
- Shares of Panama
 - Non-usable shares no ditch to transport to Owl Lake
 - Used for trades or leased out
 - Storage shares (56 shares of class B)
- The HOA lake holds about 10-acre feet per fill. 1-acre foot = 325,851 gallons

Leased Water (Storage Water or CBT Water)

- On average, the HOA leases 30-50 shares of storage water yearly when available
- Leases: The HOA leases full shares. 1 share of leased storage water = 1 acre foot of water
- Can only run CBT / Storage water July September

Average Market Value Per Share

- Coal Ridge Ditch = \$3,000-\$5,000 per share when available
- Storage or CBT water \$22,000-\$32,000 per share when available
 - Purchasing shares for water we need equate to 40-50 storage shares with an estimated cost of \$1,200,000 \$1,500,000!

ACC PROPOSAL FOR SIGN LANDSCAPING

Attached are three Landscaping plans for the common area surrounding the "Owl Lake Estates" sign. . Out of five plans proposed, the ACC team chose three. The plans were developed keeping several factors in mind.

1) The areas surrounding the Owl Lake Estates community is growing rapidly and will probably continue to do so. Because this will most likely bring young children into the immediate area, we felt that safety measures should be included into our plans. We have added a heavy wire livestock fence or a living fence plus a heavy wire livestock fence into all plans.

2) The current "lawn" surrounding the sign is unsightly. At a minimum, all plans require a level area around the sign ending with a retaining wall. Ideally, the entire area between the Lafevre property and the Sharp property should be leveled, reseeded and ended with a retaining wall.

3) All plans have a 60ft X 80ft gravel bed surrounding the sign and the existing spruce trees

4) All of the submitted plans can be done in stages. However, in the event that we are able to fund this project, it may be more cost effective to complete it in one year. The down side of extending the work over several years may increase our total investment due to inflation.

We suggest that a landscaper be hired to do most of the work, i.e. trucking in dirt, setting the wire fence, building retaining walls, planting the grass and/or trees. The suggested flower and decorative grass plantings are readily available through catalogues, but will require that we not procrastinate ordering in early spring. We suggest that a work crew be hired and needed supplies be identified and purchased very early in the coming year so plantings can be placed as soon as they arrive.

Plan 1 (See Attachment 1) is the simplest of the three plans. Metal edging would surround the gravel bed, creating a sharp boundary between the gravel bed and the buffalo-grass lawn. Planted within the lawn in groups would be switch grasses and cone flowers. See Exhibit 1 for an example of the flowers. Towards the back and along the livestock fence would be tall prairie grasses and Russian sage. Exhibit 2 shows examples of the grasses. Costs are summarized in Table 1.

The plan, shown in Attachment 2, starts with the same leveled area between the two bounding properties and the livestock fence. The "lawn" in this layout is an area filled with a prairie flower mix. Towards the back is a mixture of prairie grasses, Echinacea/daisies and Russian sage arranged in groups. See Exhibits 1 & 2 for examples of the suggested plantings. Costs are summarized in Table 2.

In Plan 3 (Attachment 3) the gravel bed is slightly raised in front and finished with a brick retaining wall. The surrounding lawn is all buffalo grass. Located on either side of the gravel bed are two kidney shaped raised beds containing flowers. Blue spruce/pine trees create a living fence in front of the wire stock fence. See Attachment 3. Predesigned flower bed plantings can be purchased at reasonable costs from the Michigan Bulb catalog. See Exhibit 3 for examples of flower beds. Costs are available in Table 3.

Costs that are common to two or more of the designs such as the gravel bed, the fence, soil for approximately 18,000 sq ft between the two bounding properties and grass for that area are itemized in Table 1. We may be able to obtain clean land fill for our 18,000 sq ft area from one of the several new construction projects currently underway in our local area. But, we will have to act quickly on this if possible since there are probably other people with similar ideas. Please deal with Dan Sewczak directly on this matter.

We did not include any landscaping costs. These are costs have not been itemized into any of the plan "total costs". We need a firm plan in hand for the landscaper to view for an estimation of cost.

Lastly, the entire team agreed that anything we do around the sign will be an improvement. However, everyone voted on Plan 3 as being the most desirable regardless of the cost.
